CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

In accordance with current advice from ACT Health and Dogs ACT, ACT CDC wishes to advise that this trial will be restricted to competitors that meet the following criteria;

- Handlers, officials, and visitors must not have been in a COVID Hot Spot as identify by ACT Health and/or NSW Health in the 14 days prior to the date of the trial

 Note; NSW Government "However, NSW Health currently recommends delaying non-essential travel within NSW, especially between Greater Sydney and regional and rural areas."

By entering this trial you agree to abide by the ACT Government Covid-19 restrictions, Dogs ACT COVID- 19 Agility Trials General Practices for Affiliates and Handlers available online at https://dogsact.org.au/event/agility-jumping-trial-cdc/2020-10-31/ and any Covid-safe practices implemented by ACT CDC including checking in to the venue through the "Check in Canberra" app.

- There shall be NO setting up of any exhibitor equipment prior to 3.00 pm on the day of the trial

TEMPORARY CHANGE TO ANKC AGILITY RULE REGARDING LEADS AND COLLARS

Current Rule:

7.2.1 On the Steward's call of the dog's catalogue number, the Handler will enter the ring via the entry point, with the dog on lead and follow the Steward's and/or Judge's instructions. The lead and harness or head collar must be removed, the collar may be removed and all items handed to a Steward.

The temporary modified Rule:

'7.2.1 On the Steward's call of the dog's catalogue number, the Handler will enter the ring via the entry point, with the dog on lead and follow the Steward's and/or Judge's instructions. The lead will be removed, the collar maybe removed. The Handler will either place the lead/collar in a pocket whilst running the course or wear it on them (e.g. clipped around their waist like a belt). If any of these items fall to the ground or the dog grabs the lead while running the course this will result in a DQ. The lead/collar must be inaudible and if not this will result in a DQ.'
